# ROBBER'S ROW GRILLE

At the start of the Civil War, the present Port Royal Plantation was occupied by Confederate forces. In the Battle of Port Royal in 1861, the Confederate troops were defeated, and 13,000 Union troops landed to take control of the island. A town quickly sprang up with over 15,000 civilians to complement the military presence.

Restaurants, a theatre, stores, newspapers and saloons all prospered, centered around the main street known as "Robbers Row." Historical markers at Fort Walker Park, the Beach House and the Steam Gun describe events that took place here and in the surrounding waters.

When you play holes 9 & 10 of Robbers Row Course, you will be playing over what was in 1862 Port Royal's Main Street. Saloons, tattoo parlors and theaters were built here by settlers, enterprising business men and con men with the hope of fleecing the 20,000 to 30,000 Union troops stationed here.

Hence the name Robber's Row
